FASH 'Chat' – Carolling

For over fifty years, I have wanted to take part in the Sheffield and Derbyshire carolling tradition. This year it ran from 11th November through to 3rd January, including 160 events, which is a long time to spend there, so on 7th December I went to the 'Festival of Village Carols', which has been organised for about 30 years by a committee under Ian Russell. The exact location varies each year, but this time was in Grenoside, just north of Sheffield itself. The Festival is supported by the West Gallery Association, which is perhaps best known in this area through 'The Madding Crowd.'

This festival is not for the fainthearted; it started at 9:45am and went through to 11:15pm, with breaks for lunch and evening meal. Moreover, for quite a bit of that time, we were handed sheet music written in fourpart harmony and given the instructions "Off you go!" During the workshop we sang many carols that are far from well known outside the 'Egypt', 'Once More', region. such as 'Prospect' and 'Fleecy Care'. However, by way of a break we were also treated with twelve from The Redruth Carol Choir, six from the 'Traveller's Rest' pub in Oughtibridge and a performance of three from the 'Royal Hotel' in Dungworth by four school age violinists. This last is perhaps an indication of the latest threat to the carolling tradition, since the pub closed its doors in March 2024, after being the local for over 200 years. Like so many pubs, there was just not enough custom for it to be viable.

Nevertheless, the carollers are not giving up! We had these young instrumentalists – 'The Royal Quartet' - while the main singers have moved a little way down the road to meet in 'The Old Band Room', which is, I gather, a community centre of sorts.

The Festival usually has a visiting guest from elsewhere, and this year it was a researcher and choir from Redruth in Cornwall. Like the Sheffield and Derbyshire carols, this research was not a record of what happened in the past, but part of a project based on visiting lots of places in Cornwall and recording what is still being sung in the pubs, clubs and streets. Redruth used to be a major centre for Cornish carols - the original collectors and several songsmiths came from there - but there was little still current in the this town until choir was created. Accompanying this project is a book 'Hark! The Glad Sound of Cornish Carols'.

Another notable event at the Festival was the publication of a manuscript from the village of Eyam. This consists of a photocopy of the manuscript then a second copy where everything has been transcribed much more clearly. A goodly proportion of these were not known from elsewhere.

As those interested in carols will know, there are an inordinate number of tunes for 'While Shepherds Watched'. The Cornish project found 34 sung there, though the book includes a mere eight (plus a local version of Page 2

'Lyngham'). The Eyam manuscripts add another one, though I haven't checked to see if it is distinct from other local versions.

So, all in all, a very interesting experience.

I will probably go again next year, unless I go to one of the other areas where a carolling tradition continues.

You will note a new addition to the Dance Diary in this month's issue of 'Solent Waves'. After several year's absence there will once again be a Folk Dance group, or more accurately a Country Dance group, in Chichester. The new group, started up by Abigail Penfold, will not meet in Fishbourne as did the previous one, but in St Wilfrid's Church Hall, Sherborne Road, and will



be on most Wednesdays (I hope to include which Wednesdays in the diary). The first meeting will be on the 5th of February, and we gather there is adequate parking around the hall.

Hearing of the success of the Bournemouth Folk Dance Club's Tea Dance in November, to which the Bournemouth U3A dancers were also invited. led me to see what other U3A folk dance groups are active in our area. I knew that the Eastleigh group had closed due to low numbers, but there are several others: the Bournemouth group meets on a Monday in the Freemasons Hall in Knole The group leaders are Liz Neal and Road. Richard Lane, who are both also involved in the Woodlands Folk Dancers. More to the east, the Christchurch U3A has two International dance groups, both meeting on a Thursday in the New Church Hall, in Carbery Avenue. The leaders are Janet Mason and Janice Harris, with the earlier session at 10.15 aimed at beginners and improvers.

Ferndown U3A appears to have a Country dance group led by Barbara Westcott, but the fact that it does not appear in the "Groups with Vacancies" suggests that it might be full. Fairly near, Verwood also has a U3A Folk Dance group led by Mike Billington. It meets fortnightly on a Friday, and the page on the website suggests it is mainly Regency in style.

Coming further east I found there is very little in the way of U3A folk dance around Portsmouth (confirming my suspicion that Portsmouth is a bit of a folk dance 'desert') with the exception of Gosport. Barrie Bullimore leads a group there, monthly on the second Monday, in the Methodist Church in Stoke Road. Note that Gosport U3A also has a Folk Music group which meets on the second and fourth Wednesdays each month under the leadership of Gerry McGuire.

If any of these dance groups is of interest to you just search the web with "U3A" and the town name you are interested in to find the active groups and the contact details of the leaders. Membership fees seem to vary among the many locations, but once paid you are entitled to join more than one group (provided of course there is space) and participate in other activities.

Having ceased presenting concert events with invited guests, Guildford's Music Institute Folk Club have now announced the dates for their 'Come All Ye' singarounds which they have renamed "Acoustic Open Stage". As long as it is acoustic any music genre is welcome, together with poems and stories. No need to book; if you are a performer, expect to do a couple of spots, one in each half. We are reminded there is a bar, and admission is £3 whether you are a performer or have just come to listen.

missed a FASH workshop and presided over the kitchen for us. She was a loyal supporter of all things folk and loved dancing until bouts of giddiness prevented her from enjoying it so much. She joined the FASH committee many years ago, taking responsibility for providing the tea, coffee and biscuits. When the weather got colder, she also made delicious soup! For as long as I can remember, no matter what the weather, Elizabeth turned out to watch Wickham Morris and other sides celebrate New Year's Day.

She was also a musician and a founder member of the Four Marks Dance Band, in which she played her piano accordion. The band is still going strong as the Four Marks Folk Band, although she actually stopped playing with them several years ago. She was an excellent hand bell ringer and still played regularly every Tuesday with the Kingsworthy Bells until a severe stroke put her in hospital in July 2024. On two occasions she brought her own set of hand bells to Soberton for the Do Something Different workshops. We all enjoyed having a go, but it made us realise how much skill was involved in playing them properly!

We learned from her family that she was for many years a house mother in a Methodist children's home, which might explain why she was so good at catering for large numbers. When Daphne and I got married 10 years ago Elizabeth was incredibly kind and made mountains of scones for a cream tea after the ceremony! When child care policy changed in the 1980s many children's homes, including Elizabeth's, were closed and the children were fostered instead. Elizabeth and another house mother then set up and ran a small and very successful care home. She came to Hampshire when she retired and looked after her father until his death.

Elizabeth was a lovely person and a good friend and we will all miss her. A Thanksgiving Service for her life will be held in St Peter's Church, Bishop's Waltham at 2pm on Saturday 25th January, followed by a reception in the Church Hall at 3pm. She was always such a positive person and the family think she would have preferred people not to wear black. It will be good to meet other people who knew her and be able to share many happy memories.
