FASH 'Chat' – the "Rising Music Festival"

The people of Whitehill & Bordon have spoken, and The Phoenix has delivered! This summer, Hampshire's beloved theatre and arts centre hosts the inaugural 'Rising Music Festival': Whitehill & Bordon's first EVER two-day youth music festival, in association with BackBeat Collective.

Taking place on Saturday 21st & Sunday 22nd June, the Rising Music Festival will showcase a plethora of upcoming local artists, with musicians aged 24 and under given a platform to showcase their skills and talent.

Whatever the genre, from rock to rap, dance, pop and folk, the festival team are handpicking the best bands, duos, groups and solo artists to appear on one of the indoor and outdoor stages across the weekend, as the next generation of musicians have the chance to show you what they're made of!

In addition to a host of live performances, the festival will include music workshops for kids of all ages, comedy, spoken word, cabaret and more. Plus, local young people will have the chance to perform a track with a group of schools and colleges in the area to celebrate this epic event.

In the lead-up to the festival, The Phoenix is hosting an epic 'Battle of the Bands' competition for under 24s, with a host of amazing prizes on offer, including a headline slot at the Rising Music Festival, free tickets for the festival and help with merchandising, your logo and more.

Heat 1 takes place this Sunday 23rd March at 5pm, Heat 2 on Sunday 27th April at 5pm and the Grand Final on Sunday 1st June at 5pm. Tickets for all Battle of the Bands events can be purchased on the door or via The Phoenix website (*www.phoenixarts.co.uk*/), costing £6 (or £5 for concessions and under 24s).

The Phoenix and BackBeat Collective are also putting on a series of FREE workshops aimed at young people who are interested in a career in the arts. With networking opportunities, group mentoring and talks from industry professionals, these free sessions are also bookable via The Phoenix website.

The next workshop, 'Breaking Through The Noise', takes place on Thursday 17th April at 7pm. (Apply straight away if you would like to attend). It is a workshop with a band that is living the dream and making waves in the industry. From performing at major festivals to working hard to break into the competitive music scene, they'll share their story of triumphs, challenges, and lessons learned along the way.

The third workshop will take place on 22nd May and is titled, 'Performing And Preparing For Every Gig'. Whether it's an intimate show or a festival-sized crowd, preparation is key to a killer performance. This session will focus

on how to adapt to different types of gigs and ensure you're ready for anything the stage throws your way. From creating a memorable set list to handling soundchecks and unexpected challenges, this is the ultimate guide to performing with confidence.

To expand a little bit, the Festival and the events leading up to it are not just about musicians. Phoenix Arts would also like to hear from young comedians, people interested in becoming MCs, photographers, stage managers – in fact everything and everyone related to putting on a successful show.

Their programme is presently small (lots to be added, no doubt) but they are dancing on the 27th of this month in a St. George's Day celebration on Poole Quay, together with other sides. They will be dancing out on May Day morning at the Cross Keys just north of Ferndown.

One of the more complete diaries, although at present few local, evening, dances are included, Mary Rose and Royal George's calendar tells us that they will dancing at sun-up on Portsdown Hill.

Portsmouth's Victory Morris Men have yet to publish their diary for 2025, although Mafficking Border Morris' (the third Portsmouth side) calendar shows that both sides will be in Petersfield on the 21st April for a Motor Neuron Disease Association event, possibly also with Alton Morris. Victory usually greet the May Day



rising sun at the Spur Redoubt, Portsmouth.

Wickham Morris have not yet published their 2025 calendar, but it seems reasonable to assume that they will dance at dawn in Wickham Square as usual.

The New Forest Meddlars will be celebrating St. George's day (on the day!) at the Silver Hind in Sway, then greeting the dawn on May Day in their usual location – Bolton's Bench in Lyndhurst.

Neither King John's Morris Men nor Red Stags Morris appear to have published diaries of events yet, but their usual May Day morning venue is Southampton Bargate.

Hook Eagle Morris already have a fairly extensive calendar, and as well as a 'warm-up' on

the 19th, will be celebrating St. George's Day with a local tour. They will be greeting the dawn on May 1st at the Shack Café in Hook.

We can anticipate that Men of Wight will dance at dawn on May Day at Longstone, Mottistone, possibly with other Island sides.

Next month, I hope to include our usual Morris Diary listing what most of the dance sides will be getting up to in the coming year, and on this note I would encourage any bagmen, whose sides' lists of events for 2025 are not on a readily accesible website, to let me have details of their programme for this year's events.

Finally an early reminder that the FASH AGM will be held, via the 'Zoom' application, on Sunday the 18th May at 4 p.m. Dave Sutton, editor.
