FASH 'Chat' 2 – So, How Did They Go?

We refer, of course, to our 2024/2025 series of workshops. When we looked back, the committee felt we had had a really good

well-known and very popular caller Victoria Yeomans. We anticipated this workshop would be well- attended as Victoria has called at weekends and festivals all around the country, so we were slightly disappointed with the numbers attending. We put this down to the fact that it was still very early in the season and possibly a few of our regular dancers were still taking holidays.

The workshop did show that it is not just the dancers who enjoy these sessions; Linda Game and Dave Yeomans rarely play together, but from the merriment and laughter coming from the stage, it was clear that the musicians were having as much fun up there as we were on the dance floor.

The November workshop was with Ivan Aitken, whose ready smile and usual brand of humour always helps things along. He called a range of dances from both sides of the Atlantic, some "reconstructed", some new but danced to old tunes. He was accompanied by Claire Coxwell, Judith Beton and Rick Beton; Rick was the percussion member of the trio, and it is perhaps the first time most of us had danced to a spoons accompaniment.

December saw our now regular 'Winter Gathering'. The Gathering represents a lot of work for our secretary, Daphne, as she has to organise not must one band and caller for the day, but several, plus any other entertainments such as a Mummers' play. Considering all our callers and bands for the Gathering are relatively local, it illustrates just how much talent we have in our area, including several nationally- and internationally-known callers.

January's workshop caller was Thomas Bending who had only fairly recently moved to the area (it had been suggested that perhaps Hampshire is a magnet for callers – one can but hope). Few of us had danced with Thomas before, but he proved an excellent caller, leading a lovely selection of dances from the pen of Philippe Callens. Not missing an opportunity, Bournemouth Dance Club immediately booked him for their Day of Dance next April (note the date – it will be on the 11th).

Louise Siddons led our February workshop which was a series of British contra-style dances (yes, we can write them too). What was perhaps unusual was that none of the dances included a swing – those who saw the word "contra" in the title and decided not to come missed a treat. The music was from Linda Game and Ali Messer, who play regularly as 'Box of Frogs' and who are so completely 'at home' with contra dance music that it made an excellent day into a really great one.

The annual West Gallery Music workshop with 'Madding Crowd' I cannot personally comment on, but I gather it was very successful, and attended by well over 60 participants. With this sort of enthusiasm it will certainly continue to feature in our future series of workshops. Mike Bailey was the man with the challenge of keeping all the musicians and singers in order and in time.

In March Frances Oates joined us from Cornwall. Her workshop title of "What Happens Next" was not about unusual figures linked together, but about encouraging the dancers to keep thinking about the next figure, so that as they dance, each move leads smoothly into the next and the whole thing flows. She called a range of dances from straightforward ones to some really quite challenging ones. We danced each dance twice, the first time being what Frances referred to as the "draft copy", with the expectation that the second time we would get it right, complete with all the nuances.

I should mention that Pete and Sue Hall provided the music for Frances, as they also did for Ivan in November, Thomas in January and Jane in April. We are very lucky to have two such talented musicians in our area and very grateful that they support us so often.

Jane Thomas came to us, also from the West Country, in April. She called a mix of dances, some not particularly challenging and some which definitely made us think, including a couple with rather unusual set formations. These were some of her favourite dances, both to teach and to dance, leading to a very enjoyable workshop.

So, how did they go? Absolutely brilliantly. We had a huge range of dance styles and types and some wonderful music from our bands and from Madding Crowd. We were led by very capable and experienced callers. We were delighted to see several dancers who had not joined us before but who assured us they had enjoyed the sessions and also a few people who have been to our workshops in the past but we had not seen again until recently. What more could we want?

Last year of course, quite a while after the AGM, Elizabeth Haigh was no longer able to contribute following a debilitating stroke, so we are now down to just four members. Please consider helping on the committee - your participation would not be unduly onerous; perhaps a little help on the secretarial side, or simply contributing ideas and discussing future workshops and how we can promote folk events in Hampshire.
